

A Reading from the Book of the Acts of the Apostles

ST. PAUL'S ANGLICAN CHURCH, RONDEBOSCH, SOUTH AFRICA

The church is in the area of the University of Cape Town.



Parishioners all eager to tell me "oldest continually operating Anglican Church in Southern Africa." You can see its lovely old stone exterior online. Nice square kneeling cushions made of leather like claret coloured bottoms and finely needlepointed faces that you kneel on very comfortably. I stacked up 3! Distinct, noble looking patterns reminded me of the Crusades somehow! Great colours, flag-like symbols. These cushions hang off the floor, against the pew back in front of you, with a buttoned strap on a peg. Very attractive.

I went to the Shrove Tuesday supper in their very plain modern hall. They charged .50 per delightfully thin, 10" crepe with warm lemon juice and cinnamon sprinkled atop. I could have eaten 1/2 dozen. Or you could choose a beautifully composed salad plate with some puffed sweet bread (forgot the Afrikaans name) for 1.00. A glass of bug juice included.

Went to the 7 a.m. Ash Wednesday service. The very elderly reader forgot her glasses so I jumped in, unfortunately having forgotten mine too, I said the reading was from the book of Job by mistake. Otherwise I got nice compliments on my "accent." Haha.

Nice people, mostly quite old and a good number of UCT students too were at Sunday's service. The minister spoke on the sacredness of water and we learned that it takes 1800 gallons of water in the process to make one pair of jeans; I think this was the youth outreach part of the sermon. We sang a sweet obscure hymn (to Ukrainian Catholic me anyway) about a little deer and a stream. The minister is a spirit lifting, young looking, middle aged East African scholar (someone whispered to me) I loved her unique accent, bold and bright with super diction and vowel combinations I had never heard! So many delightful sounds amidst the many cultures here.
