The Proclamation of the Word

A Reading from the Book of the Acts of the Apostles

When the day of Pentecost had come, the apostles were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs – in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine." But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in

those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

We give thanks to you, Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son. EASTER JOURNEY IN NEW ORLEANS, LOUISIANA

Arriving in New Orleans, Louisiana (NOLA) on Wednesday of Holy Week was a different experience for us; our norm was to spend the whole of the Triduum in church.

This year’s Good Friday found us doing a different kind of ‘the way of the cross’ as we wandered down Bourbon Street in the French Quarter.

Since the devastation of hurricane Katrina in 2005, New Orleans has struggled to rebuild; it was very obvious that some areas were able to bounce back while others were not. The homeless lined the streets or found shelter from the heat in the beautiful tree lined parks or under overpasses.

There was one young women sitting at the corner of the street who had a hat on the sidewalk. As the people walked by her she didn’t make eye contact, until a man tripped over her. He was walking along unaware of her there as he was focused on taking pictures on his cell phone. She was very quick to draw his attention to the fact that she too was a human being and he was too self absorbed. It was so true!

On Easter Sunday morning we experienced the true spirit of joyful expectation of good things to come at the Gospel brunch at the House of Blues with 200 others.
