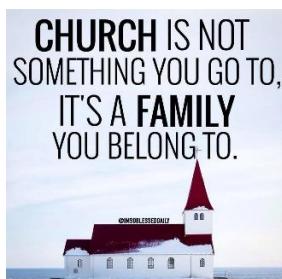

### ABOUT THE BULLETIN

Our Parish finances are under stress at the best of times, but in the winter months even more. Our heating bill alone uses virtually all of our income. We are looking for ways to save money – that is, be good stewards of what we have. One way is to reduce the bulletin in size. Bulletins with everything printed run about 20-24 pages. Meanwhile, service books already paid for sit unused at the back of the church. We are trying smaller bulletins to be used with the service books. With the improved sound system, every one should be able to hear (sitting near the front and closer to a speaker can help, too). Re-discovering our listening skills provides lifelong benefits – for older generations as well as texting, tweeting and instagraming younger folk. After all, the gospel was only heard for most of Christian history (the part when Christianity was growing!) A few large print full editions of the service will be printed for those with visual limitations.

**PANCAKE SUPPER:** Alice Murray has graciously agreed to convene the Pancake Supper which will take place on March 5. A sign-up sheet is at the back of the church for you to sign up for donated supplies and your labour. We need everyone to offer themselves for jobs both heavy and light.
